ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

The supply of alcohol is prohibited: -

- a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor, or,
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence.
- c) Every supply of alcohol shall be made or authorised by the holder of a personal licence.

Any person carrying out security activities on these premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance or harm to children-

- (a) games or activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A senior member of staff (manager) will assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity /entertainment.

Management will control the sound levels of the music/entertainment.

2 SIA registered door supervisors will be employed at the premises from 23:30 hrs to the close of the premises on Fridays and Saturdays. This will include Christmas Eve and New Years Eve.

CCTV will be installed, operated and maintained to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer of Police and Licensing Authority. This will be achieved by compliance with the document: CCTV Systems installed within licensed premises in Mid Devon - Operational requirement Analysis Reference: Version 6 - September 2013 - Tomato Café / Bar.

The CCTV agreement, within the Operational Requirement document, will be signed and dated by the premises licence holder or a person authorised to sign on behalf of the premises licence holder.

The signed CCTV agreement and the completed CCTV operational requirement document or a true copy of the document/s will be maintained at the premises available for inspection by a police office or an authorised officer of the licensing authority at any reasonable time.

OUTSIDE AREA

The licensed area will be marked with a permanent red line.

The outside furniture will provide a maximum of 12 covers and will be of the type where the seats are attached to the tables.

All of the outside furniture will be removed from the area by 23:00 Monday to Sunday.

The only drinks permitted outside will be served in polycarbonate glasses and no bottles will be served outside.

No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the building after 23:00 hrs.



A review of the premises licence is sought on the grounds that the premises are not promoting the following licensing objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance.

Grounds for review:

A continued disregard for the existing premises licence conditions, in particular the conditions relating to use of the outside licensed area. Evidence exists of a continued breach of these conditions. These licensing breaches are impacting on Policing in the town causing crime, disorder and public nuisance.

The objectives set out in the action plan of October 2014 have not been met.

Attempts to work in partnership with Mr Babolhavaeji have failed. Guidance offered by Police on how better to manage and control the outside area was initially taken on board but has since been met with a refusal to co-operate. Mr Babolhavaeji has then submitted a minor variation to remove the conditions that we seek to enforce.

Mr Babolhavaeji and his doorstaff have shown an unwillingness or inability to control customers at these premises. This is leading to disorder and nuisance.

There is a high level of drunkenness at the premises.

We suggest therefore that despite Police recommendations the premises is still not taking adequate steps to meet the licensing objectives.

I am Police Sector Inspector 5938 Jane Alford-Mole of the Devon and Cornwall Constabulary currently stationed within the area of Mid Devon. Within my role I have Supervision of almost 70 Officers within Tiverton, Cullompton and Crediton. I have held the post of Inspector since February 2014, previous to this I was the Sergeant of Tiverton Police Station and I had held this post since January 2013. My previous role as a Sergeant was within the busy City Centre of Plymouth. I have spent most of my career as well as other things Policing the Evening and Night Time Economy within the area of Union Street, The Barbican and The Hoe in Plymouth, an area which is extremely busy and therefore I feel I have experience and excellent knowledge of Licensing issues, offences relating to Alcohol related violence. Public Order and Anti Social Behaviour.

On arrival in Tiverton in January 2013 I was made aware of a premises of concern named Tomato Cafe/Bar within the area of Bampton Street, Tiverton. The previous Sergeant Paul Roberts and local Officers had submitted Licensing Forms to the Police Licensing Department in relation to a Drinking Competition that had been held at the premises and supported by the owner Mr Ahmad Babolhavaeji, I will refer to the Owner in this statement as Adam, he is known within the Tiverton Community as this. Following enquiries into this by local Officers Adam was invited to Tiverton Police Station to be interviewed under caution by the Licensing Officer Anna Bridgeman and Acting Police Sergeant Michael Martini. Adam admitted the allegations and consequently received a Caution and agreed to take part in the well supported and well run local Pubwatch.

Following this intervention with Adam his premises appeared to improve. I was quite aware that in fact the issues around the Licensing objectives were not on a grand scale as opposed to many Public Houses within the Cities, however Tiverton is a Market Town and the numbers and disorders would be extremely relative to the Community and would cause a bigger impact because of the surrounding residential areas and perception by the public. Unlike bigger cities where it would be usual to have many

Public Houses next to each other, with clubs also adjacent Tiverton has restaurants, shops and a more Community feel and would be suitable for families to walk and feel safe. Again it is also relative to the number of Police Officers available to be able to Police incidents in a small town unlike the larger Cities where more resources would be available. Tomato did improve for a while and then in May 2013 I was on duty covering the Evening Night Time Economy, it would be usual for me to check all Licensed premises at this time to ensure that Designated Persons, persons outside and inside are keeping to the Licensing Objectives and persons present are out enjoying themselves and not causing any problems to others. My attention was alerted to Tomato following a call from the Pubwatch Radio, this was from a female doorstaff member. A disorder had occurred but it had been dispersed. I completed a comprehensive Police Statement following this evening. I had noted that there were large members of the Public present outside the premises smoking and drinking within a large area outside of the premises and those present were not controlled to the location directly outside of the pub. In fact this was confirmed by doorstaff as 106 people present. I attach this statement as exhibit JAM/1. You will see that the Licensing objectives were breached:- Prevention of Public Nuisance, the prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. Following this a meeting was called with Adam, the local Mid Devon District Council Licensing Officer Marjorie Parish (now retired), Police Licensing Officer Barry Sleight and Myself. This took place in July 2013 and Adam was given the opportunity to complete a Minor Variation application with conditions to ensure that the Licensing Objectives were met. These were very clear and Adam who was at the meeting agreed and said that he understood, this was all put in writing and officiated, Adam signed. Again things improved at Tomato for sometime. Occasionally there were incidents but a vast improvement on previously. The Doorstaff were consistent and co operative as was Adam.

At this stage I would say that I have always worked with Adam and have been extremely fair as I would be with any Designated Person/Owner/Licensee, I understand in these times of austerity how hard it is for businesses to keep going and I would always support local businesses but I also have a responsibility to the local Community. If any premises were causing me concern I would take initial action by speaking with the Designated Person informally and I have done this on occasion with other premises. This has always worked and the Designated Person has put things in place to everyone's satisfaction.

Following the Minor Variation being approved and conditions set again things improved for a while but recently have deteriorated to a concerning level. Officers who were working would make me aware of issues at the premises and breaches of his license. Formal Forms were being submitted. Again breaches of Adam's license and the Licensing objectives. It was clear that this needed to be addressed, as Sector Inspector of Mid Devon it is my responsibility to keep the public safe and secure, to ensure

those who wish to go out and enjoy an evening are not disrupted by those wishing to cause misery and mayhem. Officers have recorded incidents of persons within the premises being allowed to take their bottles, glasses outside the premises on a regular basis, I have actually seen this myself on many occasions and have actually called Adam out to note these events. In general persons intoxicated and causing ASB outside of the premises, Also, general drunkenness of customers. Adam and doorstaff being unable to identify those who are his patrons outside to those who have just come up to the location to mix with the patrons and then a disorder occurs, needing my Officers to sort out the aftermath. This is not a one off this has become a very regular occurrence. It is my belief that Adam is able to run his premises efficiently up until Midnight and then he is unable to control due to the layout of the bar. There have also been complaints from Officers and retailers regarding patrons of the Tomato Bar due to persons being outside using the car park and back exits/entrances as a public toilet, persons urinating and vomiting. This was confirmed when I visited a Funeral Director next to Tomato who had been called out to a death late at night and had gone to the premises and had to clean out the rear doorway due to fresh vomit. Again Officers comment on persons from Tomato urinating in these locations due to being outside.

I have spoken to Adam on occasions giving him advice, for example saying that within larger Towns and Cities having a roped off area to distinguish between his patrons and those who are not. A roped area with plastic style stands and nylon strapping, even lightweight aluminium would work, again large premises use these, it would be rare for them to be used as weapons. This works because Doorstaff have a better control of their customers. If there is disorder away from this area Police can deal with these issues without it being connected to their premises. Adam initially was in agreement with this, however he has decided not to do this. His red line marking I have always told him is inadequate for the purpose, persons do not notice a line on the floor. I still would have a concern about the Tomato area even if controlled as the area is relatively small and would be difficult to control within warmer months due to overcrowding.

I see a pattern with Adam that he will be held to task, improve, be co operative and after a time he will breach his license, the actions from his premises deteriorate, become unacceptable, he becomes unhappy with the local Police who have to address these incidents and then he states that he is being picked on, when this in reality is not the case. As Police Officers we all have to be fair and impartial. We do not have these issues with any other premises. Our intelligence department have raised a tasking for Officers to attend the location, this would be due to the number of incidents and concerns by Officers. I have never received a complaint that I have been unfair, in fact quite the opposite that I have good knowledge of the premises within my area, but I am fair.

I would ask that with any review consideration is given that Mr Babolhavaeji has conditions placed on him that the premises close at Midnight. I am concerned that during the winter months Patrons will mainly stay inside due to the cold and rain but again in the Spring and Summer, persons will be outside and the area outside will become crowded again and unmanageable. A roped area would be suitable for the winter months. As Sector Inspector for Mid Devon it is my duty for Officers to be placed where there is demand, this premises has continued to have an impact on my Policing and resourcing which I am find is of an unacceptable level.

almost the right and left side of the premises. To the left side of the bar is a flight of stairs and these stairs leads to another upstairs bar area. Adam was dancing and singing with two other males either side of him. At this time the female security doorstaff. Clare said to me that she was concerned as there were two doors and with only two doorstaff supervising they were not able to control the two exit/entrances and the upstairs. She also said that there had been live music all evening and this had started before they had started their shift which was at 2200hrs. She said at 0120hrs she had approached Adam and said that his Live Music Conditions were until 0100hrs and the band were still playing, Adam had allegedly told her to mind her own business. Following this and the concerns I walked into the premises and saw a female bar member and a male bar member. I asked the female who was managing the bar and who was the Designated Person or License Premises holder. The female said she did not understand, she appeared foreign and she got a young male. The male said he was in Managing the Bar. I asked to see the License Summary to which he showed me it clearly displayed on the wall inside the bar area. I had a look at this and could not see the conditions for the door staff so I asked to see the Full Premises License. At this time Adam came behind me. I smiled at Adam and said I need to see your Full Premises License with your detailed conditions on. He said "ITS BEHIND YOU". I said "No thats your summary, I said you should have one here". He said" I HAVENT GOT IT". I said "What time does your Door staff come on duty"? He said 2200hrs. I asked him what time the band started and finished, he said "JANE WHAT'S YOUR PROBLEM? We moved outside away from the loud music. When I got outside the premises Adam became extremely irrate. In my opinion he was drunk. His breath smelt of intoxicating liquor, he was unsteady on his feet. He said in a loud way "JANE, JANE, DO YOU WANT ME DOWN THE STATION LIKE YOU DID LAST TIME, DID YOU LIKE TO SEE ME SWEAT LIKE LAST TIME". I believe he was referring to the voluntary interview in January when he was questioned at Tiverton Police Station. He said "WHAT IS THIS ALL ABOUT JANE, WHY ARE YOU PICKING ON ME"? I said "Adam, I have not seen you since our last meeting at the Police Station, I have been to other licensed premises this evening and other licensees have been co operative. He started to grab his own fists and circled them in his hands. He said "WHY ARE YOU ALL HERE 5 OF YOU. TO INTIMIDATE ME AND MY CUSTOMERS". I said "There are four Officers here and we are here because it is busy, we were called to a fight by your doorstaff". He said "MY DOORSTAFF SHOULDNT HAVE CALLED YOU". I SAID "Yes they should have, they have done exactly the right thing, they have a duty and that really concerns me that you are saying otherwise". At this time he became more agitated and was raising his voice at me and continued to say I was picking on him and that we were trying to intimidate him. At this time I said "Adam, I am saying nothing more to you, I am concerned at your behaviour and because you are behaving in this way I would suggest that you do not talk to me anymore, you are being argumentative and obstructive". By this time the premises had closed and he took the doorstaff inside the premises just inside the entrance to the right door. I then could hear

him shouting at the doorstaff but I could not hear words said. I could see him pointing and shouting. There were customers outside and I felt it was shocking that a licensee could resort to this behaviour when he had customers outside who had been drinking and could see what was going on. I could see inside the door the female Doostaff member becoming upset. She came outside with the male doorstaff member who I know as Darryl SMITH, the female was distressed and crying, she had tears coming down her cheeks and she was calling someone on her phone, she got through and was trying to get her words out but was too distressed to talk properly and handed the phone to her male colleague. Both the staff said Adam had shouted about them calling the Police and because of this had said "GET OUT AND DONT COME BACK". In effect they had been sacked because they had been conscientious. The female then proceeded to tell me that she knew she was going to get sacked as earlier on she had questioned him about the Live Music times.

Whilst waiting for me to return to the Tomato, both PC ISAAC and PC MARTINI were trying to disperse groups that were building up for a fight outside the premises. There was no one else present now the doorstaff had gone and Adam was standing by the door and did not intervene or tell anyone to leave. Police were calming the situation.

PC ISAAC told me that she had observed a female who was the female bar staff I had spoken to earlier. PC ISAAC told me that Adam had spoken to her in a foreign language and then the female started to take pictures of Officers on her phone. PC ISAAC had asked her why she was doing this. PC ISAAC told me that Adam had said "ITS NONE OF YOUR BUSINESS, AND GET OUT OF MY RED BOX". The red box is the corden area outside of the right exit/entrance area. Known as the smoking area. PC ISAAC told me that Adam had said he did not have to tell her names of any members of his staff, at this point he was getting irrate and grinding his jaw. PC ISAAC also told me that Adam had said to her "FTK OFF WHAT ARE YOU DOING HERE". When asked again why there were photos being taken PC ISAAC said Adam had said "YOU WILL FTK KING SEE", TELL JANE YOUR BITS AND PIECES" as she was writing in her Pocket Note Book. He then said "YOU SHOULD GET OUT OF HERE. PC ISAAC said that she had replied "I don't have to move. This was in front of members of the public and customers who had been in the Tomato previously. PC ISAAC had told me that one of the members of public had even questioned and challenged Adam because of the way he was speaking to PC ISAAC.

As I returned from talking to doorstaff he was sweeping the floor outside and PC ISAAC said he was murmuring "FINEK YOU".

I would also like to add that myself and PC Michael MARTINI observed customers attending the Pizza shop opposite buying food, leaving the outside of the Tomato with drinks and returning outside the Tomato with their drinks in hand.

On leaving the location at approximately 0320hrs I said to PC ISAAC and PC MARTINI that I would expect Adam to contact me in the morning as he would realise he should not have behaved in that way. When I arrived in work this afternoon at 1500hrs I opened an email from Adam requesting a meeting with me. I have not replied to that email.

The Licensee could not produce a full license with conditions when asked to do so. He was obstructive, rude and would not listen to words said. He was rude to other Officers present and was not in control of the premises. The doorstaff were extremely concerned about the direction from the licensee before they were dismissed, they did not feel supported. In the words of the doorstaff it was run like a "Shambles". They were unable to control the amount of people outside of the premises and upstairs within the premises. When we arrived at the Tomato and following the proceeding interactions with the licensee and premises I was deeply concerned and considered obtaining Inspectors authority for a Section 161 Closure. This was due to the likelihood of disorder which had happened, was likely to happen if the premises remained open that evening. Due to the time of night it was closing time and therefore this was unnecessary.

Without these conditions any customers would be allowed to consume these drinks anywhere and could take open pint glasses or bottles and walk away with these. Customers would also be able to drink outside until closing (which is 03:00 at weekends). This is likely to cause an increase in noise.

Routine checks by Police Officers on Tomato have evidenced that some of these conditions are not being complied with. This is a regular occurrence. It has recently been suggested by Mr Babolhavaeji that these conditions are confusing and unenforceable. However, I believe the intention of the conditions attached to the licence is clear. The intention is that this premise operates as a 'cafe' with an outside seating area which may be used by customers until 23:00. After that time it is a bar and consumption of alcohol is confined to the inside of the venue.

On 11 November Mr Babolhavaeji submitted a Minor Variation application in which he sought to amend the wording on some of these conditions and remove others altogether. He was aiming to remove the very conditions that we had been working with him to enforce.

As Police Licensing Officer I objected to this minor variation as I felt that the removal of the demarcation of the outside area and the removal of the conditions that stopped drinks being taken outside after 23:00 would have a negative impact on the licensing objectives. My objection is submitted as Appendix F. I am aware that Environmental Health Officer Ian Winter also submitted an objection to this application. As a result of these objections the Licensing Authority refused the application.

When Police Officers visit a licensed premises they will submit a licensing report known as an L10 to the Licensing Officer. As part of my role I will collate these reports and follow up any breaches of licence conditions.

L10s from Officers have indicated that there is regularly disorder at this venue. The disorder is sometimes within and sometime outside the venue. There are also incidents of drunkenness and violence at Tomato. Police Officers have reported that they do not feel that the doorstaff employed at the venue have control of the customers, either inside or outside of this venue. Doorstaff appear to lack knowledge and do not appear confident to deal with difficult customers.

03/06/14 - I visited the premises to discuss the L10 reports with Mr Babolhavaeji that indicated his doorstaff were not being effective and appeared to lack the ability to control customers at Tomato. Mr Babolhavaeji denied this. I asked Mr Babolhavaeji to ensure that his doorstaff understood their responsibilities.

23/09/14 - I visited the premises to discuss further L10 reports with Mr Babolhavaeji. I highlighted reports that indicated persons had again been taking drinks outside for consumption outside of the designated area. This is not being controlled by members of staff. I advised Mr Babolhavaeji that in order to work with him to resolve the problems at the premises we would suggest an action plan. This would clearly highlight the issues and the action that was required to resolve them. Mr Babolhavaeli agreed that he would co-operate with Police. Progress would be reviewed in four weeks. Mr Babolhavaeji was advised that unless an improvement was seen at the premises it would be my intention to seek a review of the premises licence. My letter and action plan are submitted with this review (Appendix E).

Despite my best efforts to work with Mr Babolhavaeji we have continued to see incidents relating to glasses outside, disorder, drunk persons inside the premises and an overall lack of control of these premises by the DPS and the doorstaff. This has been shown during a recent incident at the premises at

02:00 on 06/12/14 the attending officer has stated 'doorstaff were not helpful during arrest of violent offenders who were arrested for public order offenses and resisted. These persons had been customers of Tomato and had become disorderly outside the premises'. The incident resulted in one male being captor sprayed by police and several arrests were made. Twelve Police Officers attended the disorder.

Whilst Mr Babolhavaeji has co-operated with an action plan and has been polite and helpful throughout the process, nothing has changed at Tomato. Incidents of disorder and incidents showing lack of control over customers continue. There has been no improvement.


On a positive note Mr Babolhavaeji has regularly attended Pubwatch meetings and banned known trouble makers from his premises. However on at least one occasion a person who was banned from Tomato has been allowed into the premises and has been involved in disorder which has led to one door supervisor sustaining injury after being hit with a glass.

I have worked with Mr Babolhaveji for several months now to try to promote the licensing objectives. The objectives set out in the action plan have not been met. It appears he has not taken any additional steps to prevent crime and disorder or to prevent public nuisance. The safety of members of the public is being compromised inside and outside of this venue as Mr Babolhaveji has shown his staff and doorstaff are not able to manage this licensed premise. It is of note that two of the larger incidents of disorder on 26/10/14 and 06/12/14 have occurred after 01:00 and it is clear that staff are struggling to control the venue at this later hour.

I would therefore encourage the committee to consider a reduction in the licensed hours at this venue and consider a condition that increases the number of doorstaff at Tomato, with doorstaff starting earlier in the evening to monitor customers entering the venue. This would restrict the entry to persons who were drunk which in turn would have a positive effect on the licensing objectives.

<u>Minor Variation – Tomato, William St, Tiverton</u> <u>Police Objection</u>

I write in response to the above application which seeks to amend and remove conditions attached to the premises licence.

After considering the application it is my opinion that the removal of the specific conditions referred to in the application will adversely affect the promotion of the licensing objectives. The amendment will impact on the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

This Minor Variation suggests that the existing conditions are unclear and subjective however the intention of the conditions relating to the outside area are very clear. Consumption of soft drinks and alcohol will be allowed in this area until 23:00. It is very clear from the plan attached to the premises licence (submitted along with the minor variation in 2013) that consumption of alcohol and soft drinks is to be confined to the area edged in blue on the plan.

The conditions attached to this licence were last amended when a minor variation was submitted by Mr Babolhavaeji in August 2013. The nature of the premises has not changed since this date. The 2013 minor variation was submitted following discussions with both the Police and the Licensing Authority. Mr Babolhavaeji is now suggesting (page 6 of the current application) that the previous minor variation submitted in 2013 was flawed and that conditions have appeared on this licence that should not be there. This is not the case. The conditions relating to no drinks outside after 23:00 was offered by Mr Babolhavaeji on the minor variation submitted in August 2013 following discussions with his legal advisor at Ashfords Solicitors. The condition was offered in order to promote the licensing objectives and therefore remains relevant today.



Following the multi agency meeting on 16 September, at which member of the MDDC Licensing Team were present, both Ian Winter and I raised concerns about Tomato and indicated that we would be looking to take enforcement action should we not see an improvement at this venue. The Police concerns included the apparent lack of control of the outside area and the inability of door staff to control the premises in general. This is a matter that I have discussed with Mr Babolhavaeji on several occasions. Following discussions with myself and Inspector Alford-Mole in September Mr Babolhavaeji agreed to further demark this outside area by way of a rope barrier. The aim of this would be to clearly define the area and allow customers to be better monitored by staff and door supervisors. Please refer to Inspector Alford-Mole's email to you dated 20 September which confirms these intentions. The advice we have offered Mr Babolhavaeji was designed to promote the licensing objectives. Tom Jones' letter to Mr Babolhavaeji dated 21 October undermines this advice and tells the Premises Licence Holder that he need take no such action. When referring to the rope barrier the letter states 'there is no requirement for this in your licence, there is no requirement that customer remain within the marked red area' However, the plan of the premises clearly demarks this area only for consumption. Drinks cannot be taken outside of this area. In my opinion the correct course of action is to continue to ensure these conditions are enforced, not to remove them from the licence altogether.

To remove the conditions relating to the demarcation of the outside area and to remove the condition that prohibits open containers of alcohol or soft drinks outside after 23:00 will allow groups of customers to drink outside until the premises closes. On a Friday or Saturday this could be as late as 03:00. There will also be no control over where these customers consume alcohol and therefore it will be impossible for staff and doorstaff to monitor and control these individuals when they are spread over a larger area. This will increase the risk of crime and disorder in an area that staff are already struggling to control.

In support of our objection may I draw your attention to the following Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003:

8.48 In considering the application, the licensing authority must consult relevant responsible authorities (whether the application is made in writing or electronically) if there is any doubt about the impact of the variation on the licensing objectives and they need specialist advice, and take their views into account in reaching a decision.

Further guidance is offered in 9.12 which indicates that 'the police should be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective'

May I also refer you to Section 41B:

(3) If the authority considers that-

- (a) the variation proposed in the application could not have an adverse effect on the promotion of any of the licensing objectives or
- (b) if more than one variation is proposed, none of them, whether considered separately or together could have such an effect,

it must grant the application.

The footnote to this section in Patterson's Licensing Acts 2014 (page 362) states 'the test is a strict one, where doubt exists as to the possible effect the authority is obliged to refuse. In all other cases the application must be granted.'

The above guidance, coupled with our previous indication that the Police have some very serious concerns about the running of this venue and the inability of Mr Babolhavaeji and his staff to promote the licensing objectives should lead you to refuse the minor variation application. You will be aware from my email dated 6 November, which pre-dates this minor variation application, that it is our intention to now seek a review of this premises licence and it is therefore inconceivable that a minor variation be granted to remove conditions that the Premises Licence Holder has repeatedly shown he has been unable to comply with which in turn is leading to disorder and nuisance at Tomato.



Ref: Clarification of your premises licence conditions

A letter to set out and confirm what we discussed when I met with you on the 20th of October 2014 at your premises. May I begin by saying it is refreshing to speak with a premises licence holder seeking clarity to enable full compliance with the conditions on the premises licence.

What are conditions? Conditions on a premises licence set the boundaries and rules within which the premises must operate to protect the licensing objectives, they are enforceable under section 136 of the licensing act. Breach of conditions carries criminal consequence. As such the way the conditions are worded is very important. The latest licensing act guidance dated October 2014 issued by the central government says that conditions must / should be:

- · appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives
- precise and enforceable
- must be unambiguous and clear in what they intend to achieve
- may be unlawful when it cannot be demonstrated that they are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in an individual case
- proportionate, justifiable and be capable of being met, (for example, whilst beer glasses may be available in toughened glass, wine glasses may not);
- cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond the direct management of the licence holder and their staff, but may impact on the behaviour of customers in the immediate vicinity of the premises or as they enter or leave

It is my opinion that there are conditions upon your licence that do not meet this criteria and as such are potentially unenforceable and unlawful.

So turning to the conditions on your licence set against the use of the 'Outside Area'. I will not in this letter discuss every condition upon the licence instead I will concentrate on those we specifically discussed. As required I have referred to notes contained within the premises file held by the licensing department to understand the intent behind what the condition was looking to achieve.

Condition: 'The licensing area will be marked with a permanent red line'

This relates to the area in which *licensable* activities can take place. People smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not licensable activities and therefore need not be kept within this marked area. Off sales – alcohol sold for consumption off the premises – are permitted under the premises licence for Tomato.

There is a condition relating to the removal of the outside tables and chairs from the seating area by 23.00 hours. This condition came about as a result of a representation from the police in 2008. Police Inspector Matt Lawler wanted this condition in place because he believed outside furniture could be used as weapons in the event of disorder. He wanted nothing left outside after 23.00 hours. The police, as I understand it, are proposing you buy and use metal weighted poles to form a barrier around the red area. There is no requirement for this in your licence, there is no requirement that customers remain within the marked red area and if this is in response to disorder it seems to oppose the view of the inspector who through representation placed a condition on your licence to remove the outside furniture for fear of it being used as a weapon.

Condition: 'No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the building after 23.00 hours'

On reading the wording of this condition it would appear to me to be directed at the customers of the premises not the premises licence holder. Conditions need to be worded in such a way that compliance is within the control of the premises licence holder; with no clear and specific measures set out I am not clear how the premises licence holder or your staff would comply with this condition. As such it is my opinion this condition is subjective hence unenforceable.

I am unsure as to the intent of this condition. The word 'served' suggest to me that this applies to drinks served to customers whilst outside.

I would refer to the statutory guidance which states conditions must be proportionate and capable of being met. As your venue sells / serves coffee that patrons might like to enjoy in the outside seating area I struggle to see the justification for this to be served in a polycarbonate glass. I would also refer to the example given in the guidance in relation to wine glasses. As such I also believe this condition to be unenforceable.

I hope this helps clarify the current position. I believe we need to look to clarify the conditions on your licence by means of review or variation and to that end I will look to arrange to meet with you further in the next few weeks so we can move to correct. It is vital that conditions are clear, objective, necessary, proportionate and within the control of the premises licence holder if the licensing objectives are to be protected.

The door staff at tomatic changed twice whilst I was working at the bar, but I always tell that the door staff employed were more than capable of ensuring everyones safety and quickly addressing any issues which arose within the promises. I always that I could communicate any concerns to the door staff and that concerns would be deart with appropriately. In the year, I was there, I only saw a handful of incidents where the door staff or police needed to intervene. In my experience, most of the incidents were coosed by proply attempting to enter the bar and being refused entry by the door staff. These incidents were normally dealt with quickly.

When I started working at Tomato, customers were allowed to drink witside at all times, but the drink had to boin a pastic cop after 11pm. A few months later, Annacl changed this and stated that no drinks would be allowed outside after 11pm. This is a rule which was enforced by door staff and I prequently sow door staff challenge costomers who attempted to drink outside.

Although I do not work at Tomato anymore, I do still regularly visit the bar assa - costamer. I always chips spending the evening there because there is little trouble, - people who have drank too much are doubt with promptly and there is a lively atmosphere.

Recently, I have noticed that Ahmad has made some changes to the bor. In particular, he has created a tende around the red marked area outside. Over Chirsmas, I wishted the bor on a number of occassions and noticed that outside

Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing to you in regards to recent claims that Tomato Bar, Bampton Street could potentially face having its license cut due to rise last year in anti-social behaviour. I have to express my surprise as I find these allegations wholly unjust and such a move could force a long-standing business with in the town to close its doors which is something I'm sure you want to avoid.

To my knowledge, Tomato Bar and its staff have always strived to stamp out any anti-social behaviour and are prone to removing any individuals that could potentially be a nuisance. Often these individuals haven't spent any considerable amount of time at the nightspot and have been served elsewhere before being refused a drink or even admitted at all to Tomato Bar.

On a number of occasions, individuals who have been disorderly or have caused altercations outside of the premise are passers-by who are on their way home or individuals that have been barred from elsewhere and are seeking somewhere that will serve them – in my experience staff have never served anyone who has clearly had too much to drink.

For the last six months or more Tomato has been using plastic glassware in the evenings and bar staff and door staff are quick to stop individuals from taking drinks outside of the designated area marked with a red line and most recently a crowd barrier.

All of these points encourage a positive and healthy atmosphere inside and outside the building and current door staff positively enforce both the rules of the bar and the law.

I find it unfair to challenge the license at Tomato Bar when I find it to be the safest place in town to enjoy a drink in the evening. The same cannot be said for other locations in town where I have witnessed violence, drug use and sexual assault on a regular basis in the last six months alone.

I am writing because I have seen the notice in Tomato's window and do not agree with the application to review the license.

I understand that the application says that Tomato should close at 12 midnight. I often go to Tomato after going to other pubs in town at the weekend, or when I have returned from going to gigs in Exeter. The only other venue open at that time of night is Remedies, which has a completely different crowd to Tomato.

A few of my friends and my housemates are regulars at Tomato and I like being able to catch up with them at the end of a night before we all go home. When I arrive at Tomato, everyone is normally in a good mood and I have only seen trouble there a couple of times, and it's normally over before it's started.

I've seen people be refused entry for being too drunk, and people refused at the bar. I myself on one occasion was refused service at the bar because I'd had too much to drink and was told I should be probably go home by the doorstaff.

Tomato is also kept quite clean for a late night bar. Staff are always mopping up spilt drinks, and clearing the bar so there are no safety risks.

I would be disappointed if Tomato had to close at 12 midnight, and I probably wouldn't stay out in town if it does.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to express my concern at the proposed license changes for Tomato Bar. I believe the proposed changes are not only unnecessary but will also prove detrimental to Tomato Bar as a business and will have further widespread negative effects on the town's (already declining) night time economy.

I believe the proposed changes to be unnecessary because of the rigorous steps the owner, Ahmad Babolhavaeji, has taken -and continues to take on a daily basis- to ensure that Tomato Bar has a safe, clean, controlled and welcoming atmosphere. The new door staff are strict, fair, calm and quick to preempt incidents from occurring. This ensures Tomato Bar is a calm and pleasant place to enjoy drinks with friends without the worry of any anti-social behaviour. The recently installed outdoor barrier adds to the atmosphere of control by preventing non-customers from mixing with customers – it seems to have the effect of making non-customers disperse more quickly (or decide to be customers) as it is clear to everyone who is 'in' and who is 'out'. I have noticed that bar staff are quick to ban unruly customers, and often refuse customers who have clearly had too much to drink, adding to the quality of the experience for the rest of us. As regards music, the volume is set not to go above a certain level, so regardless of the time of day, or day of the week, it does not get too loud, this is great for those of us who like to go out for a drink and have a chat with the music being in the background, and furthermore decreases the likelihood of antisocial behaviour. As a youth worker and teacher with 15 years' experience of working with anti-social behaviour I am very happy to see these appropriate and effective strategies in place as I know from experience that they work.

Being one of only two nightspots open until 2.30am on Fridays and Saturdays, and the only nightspot open until 2.30am on Thursdays, I would postulate that the bulk of Tomato Bar's trade occurs between midnight and 2.30am on these three days. Therefore, to reduce the license hours as proposed would effectively mean the end of the business. Tomato Bar fills a necessary niche in the night time economy of Tiverton. Without it, possibly hundreds of young people may stop going out in Tiverton -bearing in mind that the other nightspots do not fill the same niche- so more people will choose to spend their money in Exeter, Taunton, Bristol or elsewhere. This of course will have a knock-on effect on other night time businesses. As the owner of Jazzys Worldfood Takeaway I will be looking to immediately relocate should these changes take place, as about a third of my trade takes place between midnight and 2.30am on Fridays and Saturdays, largely as a result of Tomato Bar being open. I am sure the knock-on effect will also be felt by other businesses in the area.

It would be a shame to see such a bustling and vibrant part of the community close unnecessarily when the problems it faces are no different to pubs and clubs up and down the country, and the owner, door staff and bar staff are making some very positive steps to stamping out anti-social behaviour and ensuring Tomato Bar is a safe and friendly place to drink, after midnight as much as any other time of the day. <u>License to sell Alcohol – Mr Amad Babolhavaeji</u>

I understand that the license of Mr Babolhavaeji to sell alcohol is under threat because of action initiated by Devon and Cornwall Constabulary. I write in support of Mr Babolhavaeji's efforts to maintain his license to sell alcohol at his premises, *Tomato*, in Bampton Street.

I have known Mr Babolhavaeji ever since he first opened the premises in Bampton Street, originally named 1939. For some years I was a regular morning customer for coffee. I occasionally still visit the premises for a glass of wine or a beer. While he was also the tenant of the first floor premises I arranged with him for Tiverton Chess Club to occasionally play matches there against other clubs in Devon. At the time he said to me that he wished to attract 'the sort of people who play chess'. This in my view is a clear example of him promoting the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

Throughout all of my association with Mr Babol at *Tomato* (previously *1939*) I have only ever seen him behave as a model landlord. He is always polite to his customers, but when necessary he can be firm and decisive. I have a recollection of him refusing to serve a customer whom he considered - as did I - had had too much to drink. This is a clear example of Mr Babolhavaeji promoting the prevention of crime and disorder. I have never witnessed crime or disorder in, or in the vicinity of, *Tomato*.

I noticed recently that the private area outside of *Tomato*, used by his customers for Continental café style drinking, is now enclosed by a painted rectangular boundary, indicating the limits of the area in which his customers should be contained. This appears to me to be a clear attempt to prevent public nuisance.

Whilst recognising that the police have problems controlling anti-social behaviour on Friday and Saturday nights, it seems to me to be most unreasonable to lay the blame at Mr Babolhavaeji's door.

I do hope you will take my views into consideration when considering the renewal of Mr Babolhavaeji's license.

IN THE MATTER OF THE REVIEW OF THE PREMISES LICENCE No.MDV PR0064 OF THE PREMISES KNOWN AS THE TOMATO BAR. WRITTEN REPRESENTATIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENT.

- (i) By way of an Application dated 9th December 2014 Devon and Cornwall Police (The Applicant) seek to have the licence MDV PR0064 made subject to a Review by Mid Devon District Council.
- (ii) In support of the Application, the Applicants rely upon a spreadsheet and statements written pursuant to the CJA 1967 by Inspector Alford-Mole and their licensing officer Lesley Carlo.
- (iii) The first statement written by Inspector Alford–Mole when she was a Sergeant is dated 5th May 2013. It has little or no weight as evidenced due to the fact that it is historic and indeed the narrative within is repeated in her second statement dated 2nd December 2014.
- (iv) Her second statement gives little evidential detail but does however ask that consideration that the hours of the premises should be reduced next summer and the inference is that this is appropriate because 'persons will be outside and the area outside will become crowded again and unmanageable'.
- (v) Ms Carlo in her statement is more balanced but save as for referring to the incident logs is similarly vague as to the need for a reduction in hours and an increase in doorstaff as a proper response to the evidence they have provided.
- (vi) Dealing with the logs in turn we make the following observations (for ease we shall use the same numbering as on the spreadsheet):

- (vii) It appears from the log that the decision was made to instigate the Review on 6th November. This was taken in response to the PLH indicating that he wanted someone from MDDC to attend the meeting with the Police. At that time he had met MDDC in order to work out what should be done as a licensee. The Police have a copy of the letter (see log 48) and have not provided it. It is supplied with these representations. As of a result of the intransigence of the Police the Respondent sought to vary the licence so that the position should be clarified.
- (viii) No mention has been made by the Applicant of the fact that a nearby pub has burnt down resulting in an increase in trade at the Premises.
- (ix) No credible reason has been given to seeking the curb to midnight in particular when the issues outlined in the logs appears to be one of doorstaff and people outside.
- (x) The Police have seized this as a reason to now seek to curb opening hours.
- (xi) The licence needs to be changed so that it is practical and understandable.
- (xii) The Respondent has changed doorstaff providers; improved signage; provided proper and suitable ashtrays to reduce crowding and roped off the area outside of his premises.
- (xiii) Photographic evidence is provided to update the Committee, however, the Respondent is of the view that a hearing is not necessary and is unfounded, but wishes to give Notice that should a hearing take place he seeks to be represented by the undersigned Kitsons LLP.
- (xiv) The Respondent will supply a skeleton argument nearer the time to assist the Committee and reserves the right to seek to provide further evidence as it is anticipated that the Police will seek to serve more evidence before the hearing, as is their custom.

- The Respondent has sought through his legal advisers to speak to the Police prior to the deadline for written representations but the Police have not responded. (xv)
- We attach the correspondence from MDDC; photographs of new signage; the (xvi) marked area outside the premises; correspondence from the street pastors; and our landlord.

Ref: Clarification of your premises licence conditions

A letter to set out and confirm what we discussed when I met with you on the 20th of October 2014 at your premises. May I begin by saying it is refreshing to speak with a premises licence holder seeking clarity to enable full compliance with the conditions on the premises licence.

What are conditions? Conditions on a premises licence set the boundaries and rules within which the premises must operate to protect the licensing objectives, they are enforceable under section 136 of the licensing act. Breach of conditions carries criminal consequence. As such the way the conditions are worded is very important. The latest licensing act guidance dated October 2014 issued by the central government says that conditions must / should be:

- appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives
- precise and enforceable
- must be unambiguous and clear in what they intend to achieve
- may be unlawful when it cannot be demonstrated that they are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in an individual case
- proportionate, justifiable and be capable of being met, (for example, whilst beer glasses may be available in toughened glass, wine glasses may not);
- cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond the direct management of the licence holder and their staff, but may impact on the behaviour of customers in the immediate vicinity of the premises or as they enter or leave

It is my opinion that there are conditions upon your licence that do not meet this criteria and as such are potentially unenforceable and unlawful.

So turning to the conditions on your licence set against the use of the 'Outside Area'. I will not in this letter discuss every condition upon the licence instead I will concentrate on those we specifically discussed. As required I have referred to notes contained within the premises file held by the licensing department to understand the intent behind what the condition was looking to achieve.

Condition: 'The licensing area will be marked with a permanent red line'

This relates to the area in which *licensable* activities can take place. People smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not licensable activities and therefore need not be kept within this marked area. Off sales – alcohol sold for consumption off the premises – are permitted under the premises licence for Tomato.

There is a condition relating to the removal of the outside tables and chairs from the seating area by 23.00 hours. This condition came about as a result of a representation from the police in 2008. Police Inspector Matt Lawler wanted this condition in place because he believed outside furniture could be used as weapons in the event of disorder. He wanted nothing left outside after 23.00 hours. The police, as I understand it, are proposing you buy and use metal weighted poles to form a barrier around the red area. There is no requirement for this in your licence, there is no requirement that customers remain within the marked red area and if this is in response to disorder it seems to oppose the view of the inspector who through representation placed a condition on your licence to remove the outside furniture for fear of it being used as a weapon.

Condition: 'No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the building after 23.00 hours'

On reading the wording of this condition it would appear to me to be directed at the customers of the premises not the premises licence holder. Conditions need to be worded in such a way that compliance is within the control of the premises licence holder; with no clear and specific measures set out I am not clear how the premises licence holder or your staff would comply with this condition. As such it is my opinion this condition is subjective hence unenforceable.

Condition: The only drinks permitted outside will be served in polycarbonate glasses and no bottles will be served outside.

I am unsure as to the intent of this condition. The word 'served' suggest to me that this applies to drinks served to customers whilst outside.

I would refer to the statutory guidance which states conditions must be proportionate and capable of being met. As your venue sells / serves coffee that patrons might like to enjoy in the outside seating area I struggle to see the justification for this to be served in a polycarbonate glass. I would also refer to the example given in the guidance in relation to wine glasses. As such I also believe this condition to be unenforceable.

I hope this helps clarify the current position. I believe we need to look to clarify the conditions on your licence by means of review or variation and to that end I will look to arrange to meet with you further in the next few weeks so we can move to correct. It is vital that conditions are clear, objective, necessary, proportionate and within the control of the premises licence holder if the licensing objectives are to be protected.
