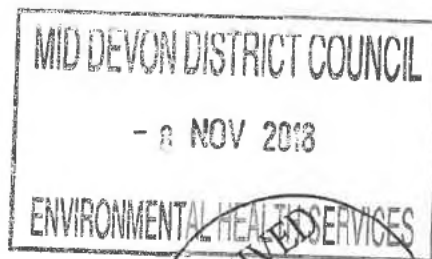

**Re: Public Notice Licensing Act 2003**

I am writing regarding West End Bowling Club Application for a licence.

We object to this Public Notice Licensing Act 2003 for live music and alcohol. This will affect us as we live right opposite the West Exe Park Gates in Higher Welbrook Street.

The bowlers make a lot of noise at night. We have asked them over the years to come out quietly but they don't consider anybody who lives in our area. They stand in our lay-by in front of our gates. One person from each car gets the cars parked on double yellow lines and on pavements and banging and slamming the car doors and shouting to each other when others are walking up the road to go home. We are going to change our gateway to try and stop them. For example when lorries try to get past but due to the road blocking due to these extra cars, lorries and tractors can't get past and therefore have to drive on to the pavement and in the past causing breakage to our concrete.

In front of the park gates it is white lines which are for emergency vehicles only.

When buses come with visiting bowlers they just park outside of our houses with the engine running. We then have to go out and see if they will move. They always say they are either keeping warm or trying to keep cool with the engine running!

Why can't the bowlers park in the community centre car park and pay and walk in from that side all the time. Also buses to park somewhere else. This would also enable to keep the road clear at all times. Because for some reason when they park here no wardens ever seem to come along to move them on. This has proven a nightmare for people who live in this street.


Anytime I have gone over to the club to speak to someone about the matter, they say they will bring it up at the next committee meeting and all you get as you walk away is people either staring at you or talking about you in an obvious way that you can hear.

If they are granted this application for more day events like their music it will affect us in our garden because of the noise. They are only thinking of themselves, because the majority don't live here in Welbrook Street.


Some days there are so many cars out on the road with disabled badges, there is no pull-ins right up the road so this just causes chaos for cars coming in each direction and nowhere to let anyone pass and pull in. Even more so of a build up when lorries and tractors are trying to get through also. When there is nowhere to pass then some have to use pavements to go up on to which more times than not is right outside our house. This is also a hazard for anyone walking past and with it being a children's park/play area (at the same park as the bowling club), a safety risk.

This application in my opinion is not on full show for people to read. It should be on the park gates where everybody can see it.

I hope you can understand why we are objecting to this planning notice and take our points in to consideration when you are considering this licensing application.

As a resident of Queen Street, I am greatly concerned by the application from West End Bowling club for a licence to sell alcohol and play live and recorded music with in an alcohol free zone (Westex Recreation ground). At present we are disturbed on a regular basis by anti social behaviour and alcohol fuelled problems in the park. I feel that granting the bowling club a licence would only increase the amount of anti social behaviour, alcohol fuelled problems and noise pollution in this beautiful park. Parking is another issue to be considered as residents struggle themselves to be able to park on their own streets at present and more traffic would make it almost impossible for them to park. I am writing to raise concerns over the licence application made by the West End Bowling Club (the "Club"). Whilst I would encourage entrepreneurship, I have concerns around the impact a licence to sell alcohol and play music may have on the local area.

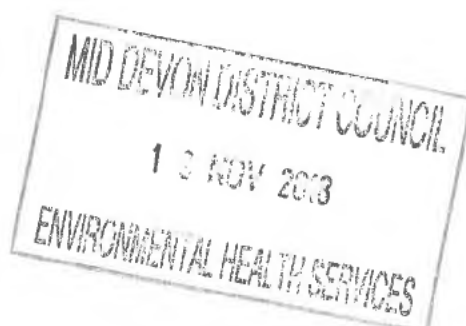
The Club members and visitors currently make use of the on-street parking locally, which as a public road they are entitled to do, however this regularly displaces resident parking. They do not car share or consider alternatives. This will potentially be amplified by having additional visitors to the site.

On Wellbrook Street there are already establishments selling alcohol and playing music, the Heathcoat Club and the Racehorse pub. It's a busy thoroughfare and by adding a third establishment it will potentially increase traffic, both in terms of vehicles and pedestrians, and therefore noise and pollution.

I am writing on behalf of myself and other inhabitants of Wellbrook Street/surrounding area, concerning the application of a Licence for the West End bowling club to sell alcohol and play live music. If the application is passed many will be affected in the area on a Friday and Saturday evening.

Firstly, there is already an issue with parking as it is - I will be lucky to find a car parking space when I arrive home from work at 5<sup>o</sup> clock. By allowing the club to sell alcohol, this will attract many more people and therefore further ~~reducing~~ reduce space to park. Also, after driving around the block about four or five times (at least!) and finding a space, I endeavour to feed my children and put them to bed; this can sometimes be tricky anyway without drunk people/live music happening opposite me. Dear Sir/Madam,

We are writing to register our objection to the potential granting of both an alcohol and a music licence (live and recorded) to the West End Bowls Club in Tiverton.

Our home backs onto the West Exe Park. We already frequently have groups of youths playing loud music and leaving lots of litter/exhibiting anti-social behaviour in the park - particularly in and around the (otherwise unused) shelter on the edge of the football field - most days (and especially in the evenings). Drugs are not uncommon in the park, nor is it uncommon to have male youths using the trees behind our home (and sometimes our garden fence) as a urinal.

Additional live music and alcohol consumption on the park would only exasperate this issue.

Even with our windows closed, we can often hear the thud of backbeat from music played within the park. When it's very loud, it can feel as though the house is shaking.

The bowls club already uses Cotteybrook as its private car park; often allowing coaches to park at the junction which connects the road with Wellbrook Street. This makes visibility difficult and driving dangerous when turning in or out of the close. (As the fire station is situated here, fire fighters in an emergency can rely on this part of Cotteybrook for parking.) If the aforementioned licences are granted, this situation will only get worse.

Thank you for considering our strong objection to the licence proposals.

Re: Tiverton West End Bowling Club - New Premises Licence

I am complaining about the lack of advertising regarding this application. Notices were put up, but only on the fencing round the club itself - NOT ON THE ENTRANCES TO THE PARK!! Some of the notices are a distance from the footpaths. See photos A+B. Not everyone in this area walks in the park, not everyone buys the Tiverton Gazette therefore it is not a well publicised fact that the club is applying for a new premises licence. People became aware of this late last week, when a few well meaning people put notes in our doors telling us about the application and notices were put up on the entrances to the park. I live right opposite the park and walk through it regularly, but did not know about the application. How can anyone put in an objection when they don't know. It seems very underhanded. The club advertises its coffee mornings etc by putting signs up outside the main gate. It seems as if the club is trying to raise extra revenue by applying for this new licence. Why don't they have an open day and advertise it in the local paper/social media. There are enough places round here where they can hire a room to have a do.

Concerns regarding the application:-

- As the club is not responsible for the actions of its customers after they leave the bowling club, who will clean up after any possible accidents in the park itself e.g. vomit/faeces/cigarette ends - bearing in mind the club is situated in a public park where children play and dogs are walked.
- We residents would be subjected to more noise coming from the live/recorded music, the noise from people when they are standing outside having a fag and when they are leaving the premises. People do not always respect the residents.
- There are already 2 well established entertainment places in Wellbrook Street - The Racehorse and Heathcoat Hall. When the bowling club and the aforementioned have dos at the same time, parking is a nightmare. Cars are parked on double yellow lines, across the dropped down kerbs and on the variuos bends. So making it difficult for both drivers and pedestrians to see what is coming. We locals have problems accessing our properties when loaded down with shopping etc. Being a residential area there are a fair few of us on the wrong side of fifty, some have disabilities and need a clear access to their properties.

The Bowling Club is situated in an **"ALCOHOL FREE ZONE"**. Photos enclosed.

Who is going to ensure that customers don't take drinks out into the park should they want a fag?? Will this encourage others to come into the park with drinks. The park has a history of drink/drugs being bought in.

I strongly object to the West End Bowling Club Alcohol and live music license application. I live a few hundred yards from the Bowling Club, which is located in a small public park. I struggle to park in my own road at the present time and it would become near impossible to find a parking place anywhere near my home if there were events taking place at the Bowling Club on Friday and Saturday evenings

I have to go over to my elderly mother on Friday and Saturday evenings, I never get home until approx. 10.00pm or later, I find it impossible to park anywhere near my house and usually end up in a dark spot near the fire station. If the bowling club had events going on and the many attending people would want to park in our roads, I would probably end up half way across Tiverton and having to walk home alone in the dark, which is not good and very scary

I am also very concerned about the level of noise produced by these events, ie music and shouting and screaming from drunken attenders, the area is currently very quiet and very residential, with a lot of elderly residents in bungalows, I am sure no-one in the area would want to have to put up with disturbance and noise

I also find it strange that a council would consider granting an alcohol license to a what would be a business, in a park that was given to the people of Tiverton for leisure, it was definitely not intended for a few to make money and disturb the local residential population. Whenever I do unfortunately see these Bowling Club members, they are usually loading up their cars with their paraphernalia, having parked in my road, leaving me no space to park, or any other of the local residents, they then drive off to wherever they live, which is not local.

If the council are intending to grant this license it should be on the strict provision that the bowling club provide adequate parking and they undertake not to park in the residential streets, there should be a cut off time for music at 10.00pm, better still don't grant any license, the Bowling Club are not welcome.
