We are writing to make you aware of our concerns regarding the licensing application for Spelt (open application reference 022935.)

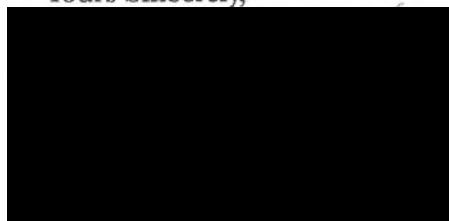
We live directly opposite the intended premises and are concerned about two main issues; parking and noise.

This end of Brook Street is the more residential end of the street and yet already parking, particularly in the evenings, can be a major issue, especially when there is an event on at the Riverside Hall. We have three young children of 7, 4 and 8 months and we sometimes have to park the other end of town when there is no space in the vicinity of our house. When this occurs it is logistically extremely difficult and bordering on unsafe walking the children and belongings back home, particularly in the winter months. Beth is especially concerned and anxious about this becoming a regular occurrence and the impact on our lives and added stress it will have.

We are also concerned about the security of Aidan's work van if it has to be regularly parked a large distance away from the house as power tools essential for work are stored within it and we do not have any other viable storage options.

Our second concern is regarding noise, primarily the noise of customers leaving the premises late at night. We both work and have to be up early in the mornings so this is a genuine worry to us.
