There shall be no self-service of Alcohol on the premises
There shall be no Admissions or re-admissions to the premises after 24:00 hours.
Suitable receptacles will be provided for cigarette litter.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The challenge 25 scheme is operation at the premises, including the forms of Identification that are acceptable
An incident log shall be kept and maintained at the premises to record all crimes and disorder.
The consumption of Alcohol shall cease at 24:00.

c) Public safety

The maximum number of persons including staff and entertainers allowed at the premises will not exceed 60
In the absence of adequate daylight, Artificial lighting in any area accessible to the public shall be fully operational.
All drinks shall be served in Plastic/Paper/toughened glass.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The performance of live entertainment will be limited to a maximum duration of 3 hours inclusive of any breaks.
Clear and legible notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of the local residents.
No speakers for amplification of music shall be placed on the outside of the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

~~Unaccompanied children under 12 will only be allowed to remain on the premises between 10:00 and 21:00~~
